

### "Family Conversation Jars for Lent":

During Lent, Christians often choose to focus on Jesus' sacrifice by the discipline of "giving something up". This year, we want to give young families the opportunity to "add something in" to their daily routine to help focus on their relationship with Jesus.

This Sunday, each family will receive a mason jar that includes 40 slips of paper, one for each day of Lent. Each slip of paper includes a question for your family to talk about. We encourage you to carve out ten minutes each day to spend time thinking about Jesus and using these questions as a jumping off point for family conversation.

Parents and grandparents are encouraged to get a jar to bring home. Kerry has a table at the kids pick-up station outside the classrooms.
