CCB — How to
(On your smart phone) -
To block out dates: log in to oslcma.ccbchurch.com and tap three bars on upper left to search. Tap **schedules** then **My Serving**, look towards top and tap **Edit Preferences** then **Blockout Dates** and click on dates you cannot serve. You don't need to give a reason why.

To check out when you are assigned: Log in to oslcma.ccbchurch.com and tap three bars on upper left to search. Go to **Schedules & Plans** then **My Serving**. It will show where you are signed up.

To ask for a replacement if something comes up (please give as much notice as possible): Log in to oslcma.ccbchurch.com and tap three bars on upper left to search. Go to **Schedules & Plans** then **My Serving**. It will show where you are signed up. Tap **Accepted** (I know it's counterintuitive), click **Find Replacement**, click **Send Message** and an automated letter gets sent to everyone on your serving team as a personal request. You do not need to write anything, make phone calls, etc. It's a great system!

YOU are Our Savior Lutheran Church in 2024!

Nov 10th, 2024

A 4 week ZOOM group/study for a fresh look at the Incarnation of God the Son. Interested in growing in your understanding of what all of Scripture shares about this?

We'll explore how God had prepared His people well for the whole concept of Jesus being born. You might be familiar with a "prophecy" verses that come up each year in the lectionary. We'll take a different approach. In this ZOOM study we'll explore how God the Son was present interacting with His people throughout what we call the Old Testament. As we look at the beginnings of the Gospels we see each of the authors connects who "Jesus" is... to the whole story that has been told already through Scripture? You'll start to recognize familiar phrases and terms that gets carried through with the language of the NT authors.

Who delivered Israel from Egypt? *some verse say it is God, some the Angel, and some God's Presence. What does the Book of Jude say about Jesus being there? How does this all tie into Christmas? Was God as a man in the Bible already? How is Jesus connected to a sword? When John says The Word became flesh... he's referring to verses in Samuel and Jeremiah about "the Word of the Lord" that give us big insights into the Incarnation*
When Jesus prays in John 17 "I have manifested Your Name" ... this isn't new...he's referring to a title found in the Old Testament. Join in exploring!


