(On your smart phone) To block out dates: log in
to oslcma.ccbchurch.com and tap
three bars on upper left to search.
Tap schedules then My Serving,
look towards top and tap Edit Preferences then Blockout Dates and
click on dates you cannot serve.
You don't need to give a reason why.

To check out when you are assigned: Log in to oslcma.ccbchurch.com and tap three bars on upper left to search. Go to Schedules & Plans then My Serving. It will show where you are signed up.

To ask for a replacement if something comes up (please give as much notice as possible): Log in to oslcma.ccbchurch.com and tap three bars on upper left to search. Go to Schedules & Plans then **My Serving**. It will show where you are signed up. Tap Accepted (I know it's counterintuitive), click **Find Replacement**, click **Send Message** and an automated letter gets sent to everyone on your serving team as a personal request. You do not need to write anything, make phone calls, etc. It's a great

system!

CCB—Church Community Builder

It has been four years since we began using CCB—a way for our church to keep connected as a community. Many people have since joined so I thought I'd give a tutorial or refresher! It's a great church community building tool and we should all use it.

Why would I use CCB?

- ⇒ CCB is where you will find our church **events** calendar, ZOOM links, etc. (The calendar is also linked to the website so you view from either place.)
- ⇒ CCB is where you update your **contact** information for our community when address, phone number, email changes
- ⇒ CCB is where you can see where your **giving** stands, and print out your annual report at year's end for tax purposes.
- ⇒ CCB is where you check what dates you have **volunteered**, or how you block out 'away dates' so that you're not scheduled in the future, or find a replacement when something comes up. (See back page of NEWS for step-by-step instructions on your phone.)
- ⇒ CCB is where **leaders** can add participants to their groups, ex: a Bible Study.
- ⇒ CCB is where a leader of a group can send a **message** to it's participants (see Diane if you need training).
- \Rightarrow CCB is where you can find another member's contact information if they have made it public to members.

Does everyone have access to CCB?

- * All Members and regular attendees have an account on and access to CCB. People <u>cannot</u> get into CCB if they have not been input by either Joel Trunfio or Diane Herth.
- * Joel, Pastor, Diane and Adam have different levels of user authority than the community so you may not be able to see everything Joel can see for instance.
- * Your financial information is <u>only</u> available to you.

Sounds good—remind me how I get on CCB & find information?

- ♦ **oslcma.ccbchurch.com or click on the link on our website.** Log in with your email and create a password if you haven't already
- ♦ If you are using a smartphone the 3 bars in upper left corner is your navigation. The left-hand side is the navigation on a PC.
- ♦ Click on PEOPLE to find a person's contact info (and check if yours is up-to-date)
- ♦ Click on GROUPS> MY GROUPS to see what groups you are involved in & receive emails on.
- ♦ Click on EVENT> CALENDAR to see what is happening or double check on a time or if a space is available for your desired event.
- ♦ Click on CATEGORY> MY SERVING to see when you are serving
