For an entire day they lined the rails, glaring at one another. Suddenly someone began to sing "In Christ there is no east or west" Then another from the opposite ship joined in. Soon there was an extraordinary chorus of former enemies unitedly praising God! That's how God works through music!!!

# "Temperature" and glass Doors,

**Contained space:** In trying to maintain a comfortable temperature in the worship space, we're asking for teamwork from all in not propping the sliding glass doors to the worship space open. The A/C in the pews tries to keep up with the flow of air from the entrance. Keeping the pews as a contained space will help it regulate and not blow cold air as has been experienced Sunday mornings.
