Adult Ed after Worship ... You're Invited! July 6th and 13th "Introduction to the Lutheran Confessions"

I'm a Christian... so why does this matter?

Christian churches teach things about Jesus. There is a collection of documents written over many decades by different people that are the grounding "profession" of what our church home teaches.

These are "The Lutheran Confessions" the Apostles' Creed, the Nicene Creed, and the Athanasian Creed, the Augsburg Confession, the Apology of the Augsburg Confession, the Smalcald Articles, the Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope, Luther's Small and Large Catechisms, and the Formula of Concord.

Why do Lutheran churches celebrate Communion different than other churches on the North Shore? Why do we disagree with Billy Graham?

Why is "Our Savior Lutheran Church" not in fellowship with churches titled as "Lutheran" in their name throughout the North Shore?

What is the difference between a "Quia" subscription and a "Quatenos" subscription to these "Confessions? (It's really important!)

We'll watch some videos, walk through some of the key points in these writings, and introduce the great Scriptural teachings in all of these that ground us as "Lutheran" Christians.

What does it mean to be a "Confessional Lutheran"?

Is "Our Savior" Confessional?

Last week we celebrated the "Presentation of the Augsburg Confession".

What is that?

It was significant... Saturday, June 25, 1530, at 3:00 p.m., there was a public reading of a document that made the "Lutheran" way of being "Church" clear to the world. The Augsburg Confession was presented to the Emperor and other significant rulers in "Europe".

This isn't the start of the Lutheran Church because the "reformers" see themselves as connecting right back to the earliest Christians. It was a realigning back to Scriptural foundations for functioning as Church.

On that day, a Biblically-based confession (profession) of what they believed, and were ready to stake their lives was read aloud and handed over. Tit was a public reading before Emperor Charles V of a series of paragraphs (articles) on doctrinal points which have come to be known in history as the Augsburg Confession. (we still use these!) Today... we are the Lutheran Church around the truth of doctrine about Jesus that the Augsburg Confession summarizes. It is right to say that we are a church of the Augsburg Confession. We do not gather to be connected around particular ways of worship or church traditions. We gather around the truth of who Jesus is and what it means to be His Church... as we see in Scripture, and this is the doctrine that is summarized in the Lutheran Confessions.

Certainly there are traditions, practices that are familiar, prayers, words and sounds that get connected to "styles". These are fine and healthy but do not define a church as Lutheran. What makes a church "Confessional Lutheran" is the centralizing point of the Lutheran Confessions. This is the grounding doctrine of what we teach and preach, and how God's Word and Sacrament are handled here at Our Savior Lutheran Church in 2025.that's pretty cool... and that is "Confessional" **Pastor Joe**
