What is a "Confessional Lutheran"? Is "Our Savior" Confessional?

It was significant... Saturday, June 25, 1530, at 3:00 p.m., there was a public pronouncement that made the "Lutheran" way of "Church" clear to the world. The Augsburg Confession was presented. This isn't the start of the Lutheran Church because the "reformers" see themselves as connecting right back to the earliest Christians. It was a realigning back to Scriptural foundations for functioning as Church.

On that day, some laymen, and some theologians made a Biblically-based confession of what they believed, and were ready to stake their lives on their confession. The occasion was a public reading before Emperor Charles V of a series of paragraphs (articles) on doctrinal points which have come to be known in history as the Augsburg Confession. (we still use these!)

Representatives from throughout Germany had united in presenting a testimony of truth before the Emperor. It was a dramatic moment. When Luther received the details of the actual presentation, he, in a letter, summed up the event in these words, "I am tremendously pleased to have lived to this moment when Christ, by His staunch confessors, has publicly been proclaimed in such a great assembly by means of this really most beautiful confession. And [so the Word] is fulfilled, 'I will speak of Thy testimonies also before kings.' *(we have that same opportunity today!!)*

We are the Lutheran Church around the truth of doctrine about Jesus There are certainly traditions, ways that are familiar, words and sounds that get connected to "styles". But, what makes a church "Confessional Lutheran" is the centralizing point of the Lutheran Confessions. This is the grounding doctrine of what we teach and preach, and how God's Word and Sacrament are handled here at Our Savior Lutheran Church in 2025.that's pretty cool... and that is "Confessional" **Pastor Joe**

"Temperature" and glass Doors,

Contained space: In trying to maintain a comfortable temperature in the worship space, we're asking for teamwork from all in not propping the sliding glass doors to the worship space open. The A/C in the pews tries to keep up with the flow of air from the entrance. Keeping the pews as a contained space will help it regulate and not blow cold air as has been experienced Sunday mornings.

Reminder: The welcoming area right by the front doors is a crucial spot for the Host team of Usher/Greeter to engage visitors and to welcome our members. Chatting and hugging and talking is an IMPORTANT part of our worship life, but please try to move past this entrance area as you arrive. It is a #1 priority spot for a visitor to be greeted.

Messiah Lutheran in Lynnfield is the closest LCMS church. Pastor Nollet gets together once a month to talk through ministries with Pastor Pekari and Pastor Brezina. Messiah has undertaken a Portuguese Ministry addressing a local Brazilian population seeking a church.

<u>General church mailings</u> might use the Member CCB list or the extended larger MailChimp list depending on the topic being communicated.

<u>Church Member mailings</u> concerning finance and voting issues use the smaller CCB Voting member list

<u>Keeping Connected</u> Pastor sends out updates, short videos, links using the Mail-Chimp list of church "contacts".

Church sign ministry: is used for encouraging and invitational messages to the community driving by. Lars is handling this ministry

Web Site: The goal is for this to be a hub of information and an education source. The hope is that it is used as more than a billboard. Currently, members will find links to our YouTube channel for latest sermon, and Weekly NEWS posted. We're looking to improve the "What's Happening page significantly, and we're presently working on the CCB calendar being utilized better. Also, a system of connecting our flock to updated educational articles and links is being worked on. One plan is a "What's New" link on home page. Reid Reesor is developing this and also researching the use of a church home "app" for our phones, and the possibility of a Christian AI portal on our web site.
