The Direction of Lutheran Worship is different

The actual and real differences in Christian denominations gets played out not only in approaches to the Sacraments but quite significantly in worship.

The direction of worship in Lutheran theology is different. In other Christian circles you might hear of worship as "giving glory to God", "bringing our best to praise Him", or coming to be quiet, separated away, and adore Him. Consider our Lutheran theology as characterized by the "direction" of worship. The emphasis in Lutheran worship is that God serves us. The focus is on what God brings to feed us.

Our "Worship" is fundamentally about God's actions. The rhythm is described as "Our Lord speaks, and we listen". The liturgy is initiated with God's Word coming towards His people. Throughout worship He serves us with His Word and Sacrament. The practices of worship are careful not to shift towards a human focus. Differences in the theology of denominations (how our relationship with Christ works) come out in differences in worship practices such as the wording of prayers, use and purpose of music, goal of the sermon, and notably in communion practices.

If you encounter another denominations materials, or practices, take note of some differences. Our goal is not to create other worldly experiences, not to elevate ourselves to encounter the Spirit, not to make a decision for Christ... it is to let Him feed us. We retell His story, we speak back to Him words He has given us, and we let our hearts get refreshed and renewed through His Word and Sacrament. This is all done in a group setting with others. Worship involves connecting our faith walk into the lives we live. Others are an important part of that walk as disciples. It is where love, forgiveness, support, patience, and encouragement get played out and experienced.

Worship is healthy... and appreciation of our worship experience involves an understanding of the direction of worship and also a strong consideration of the others God has plunked us together with to be His Church. *Love, Pastor Joe*
