Budget Awareness: At the combined Servant and Shepherd Leaders Meeting last Sunday the overall congregational budget and financial commitment was discussed. Our financial giving from the flock is down and we're approximately \$30,000 below budget at this time. The Fine Fund has been targeted to be a used for some specific upgrades here and as a blessing to God's overall church. Each department is asked to be aware of the spending done in their areas, to review the budgeted spending targeted for this year. (of which we are below covering with our giving right now).
