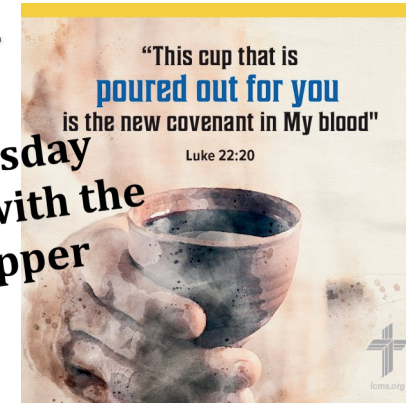

The Greatest Week in History

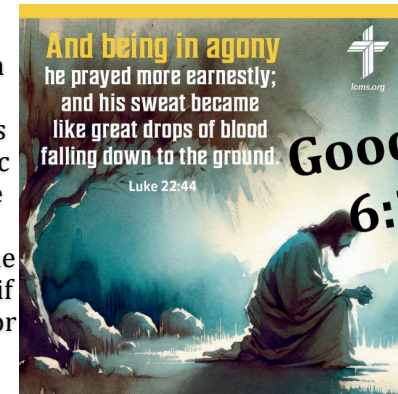

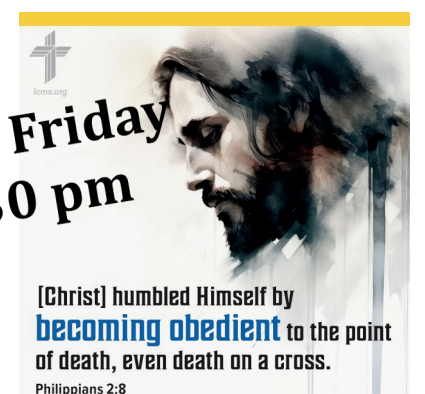

Choir Anthems for Good Friday Preparation

A kindly invitation: Please come 20 minutes early to our Good Friday service. The choir of 19 voices will share beautiful, poignant special music, all pointed to the cross of Jesus and His life's sacrifice. Be with us in our kyries and solemn witnessing through lyrics that lead us to the foot of the cross. Then, join fully during the worship service itself with the hymns that inspire and help shape our faith. ...Wendy

All Glory, Laud and Honor, LSB 442, was written in 820 AD by Bishop Theodolph of Orleans, France, while he was imprisoned at the monastery of Angers. Theodolph was well known in his day as a poet, pastor, and beloved bishop. When Emperor Charlemagne died in 814, the bishop was placed in a monastic prison by Charlemagne's son and successor Louis I the Pious, for allegedly plotting against him. A well-known legend follows: a short time before the bishop's death in 821, Louis was visiting in the area where Theodolph was imprisoned and heard him singing and worshiping by himself. When the emperor heard this particular text being sung, he was so moved that he immediately ordered the bishop's release. Since then, this hymn has become the great Palm Sunday processional of the Western church - a celebration of God's grace sung by millions throughout the centuries! I'm sure you have the refrain MEMORIZED!Wendy
